## Under 18s Computer Access

Port Broughton Area School students have access to School computers and School Internet at all times including out of school hours. School internet is filtered by DECD.

Under 18s are able to use the Community Library Internet which is not filtered **only** outside of normal school hours **and** with signed permission of a parent or guardian.

**Under 18s use of the Community Library internet is the responsibility of their parent or guardian.**

**Any material viewed by under 18s whilst using the Community Library internet is the sole responsibility of the parent or guardian.**

Port Broughton Community Library provides public access computers to our community as one of our Library Services.

### Offensive Material and Erroneous Content

The Library's connection to the Internet provides our community with access to a wide range of information.

As there are no filters to this Service the Library is not liable or responsible for any material on the Internet that any person finds upsetting, indecent, defamatory, personally offensive, inappropriate or in any way unsuitable.

Port Broughton Community Library Service has no control over the Internet's content and assumes no responsibility for the quality, accuracy, suitability or currency of any Internet resources..

## Conditions of use

### Computer Viruses

Software must **not** be downloaded to Port Broughton Community Computers as material downloaded from the Internet may contain viruses. These viruses may cause damage to a network or computer

### Ethical Use

All users of electronic information resources such as the Internet are expected to use these resources in a responsible manner, consistent with the educational, informational and recreational purposes for which they are provided.

It is unacceptable to use the Library's Public Access Computers and Internet connection for **any** of the following:

- For any purposes which violate applicable International, Australian or South Australian laws.
- Destruction of or damage to equipment, software or data belonging to the library.
- Violating computer system or network integrity, illegal use or access to Internet resources, harassing others.
- Sending, receiving or displaying text, graphics or audio which may reasonably be construed as offensive by the community including attempts to bypass network security functions, obtain passwords or alter the configuration of library workstations in any way.
- Users must not reproduce, transmit, publish or commercially exploit any information accessed through the Internet service that would infringe on copyright, trademark, patent, design or other intellectual or industrial property right of any other person.

### Links to illegal websites

**Library staff should be notified immediately** if any problems are encountered including accidental tripping of links to pornographic or violent websites.

Access to these computers is monitored by State Libraries and access to such sites can involve Police and other agency interventions.
