Yesterday Paul and I attended day three of Agile Leadership with Dr Simon Breakspear. Simon is known internationally for helping educational leaders navigate complex change, harness research evidence and drive continuous improvement for better learning. It was a very productive and interesting day and we both look forward to sharing this work with staff and the school community.

I am pleased to announce that Jess Noble-Bawden will be the Deputy Principal for terms 3 and 4. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank Paul Townsend for all his hard work as Deputy during this term.

In the past we have changed to the semester 2 timetable for weeks 9 and 10. The reason behind this is to provide equal time to semester long subjects. However, our current staffing and the appointment of a new deputy for terms 3 and 4 made this transition very difficult. After much discussion, we decided to change only the necessary subjects (year 11 and 12) and wait until term 3 to start the new timetable.

Paul and the SRC have been working with Grace McDevitt and Gaye Stevens (OT students from University of South Australia), to increase opportunities for unstructured outdoor play during break times. We have been very fortunate to receive donations that our students can now use in their creative, imaginative play and construction of huts.

Unstructured outdoor play offers opportunities to develop executive functioning skills. These essential life skills help us remember information, filter out distractions, switch gears when needed, and sustain focus over time. Children develop rules for the imaginary scenarios they create, remember and try out complex ideas, apply the rules to the scenarios as they go along, and regulate each other's behaviour.

At the end of term assembly next Wednesday, we will be making coffee and cake available for parents and community members to purchase. We look forward to seeing many of you there as we showcase some highlights from this term.

Don't forget school finishes at 2:10pm next Friday. I hope you all have a safe enjoyable holiday break.

MATERIAL & SERVICES CHARGES 2018

Thank you to families who have paid or set up payment plans for their child's Material & Services Charges for 2018.

Please be aware that school card limits have increased by \$20,000 so if you weren't eligible in the past you can earn around \$57,870 for the 2016/2017 financial year to be eligible.

If you have paid your Material & Services for 2018 but think you would be eligible for school card we can refund you \$310 for 8-12 or \$235 for R-7.


Constellations with Year 1 and 2s

What did Aboriginal people use constellations for?


- "To know what time of the year it is" - Amelia

- "For knowing where they are" - Grace
- "To know when to collect emu eggs and when to hunt. They

- The Frying Pan and Southern Cross - Ruby
- Southern Cross - Lucas
- Southern Cross and the Emu - Jaida
- The Big Dipper - Maya
