Over the next 18 months Jackie McLoughlin and Kelly Heading will be involved in a STEM 500 educators program. The professional learning program will build **upon teacher's knowledge and confidence in designing learning in the STEM** disciplines of Science, Technology or Mathematics, and through this increase student participation and build positive attitudes towards these learning areas. We look forward to Kelly and Jackie sharing their learning and incorporating it into our curriculum to make best use of our facilities.

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability

We have commenced the annual nationally consistent collection of data on **school students with disability ('the Collection')**.

This will involve the collection of: the number of students receiving adjustments to enable them to participate in education on the same basis as other students; **the level of adjustment provided to students; and where known, the student's type of disability.**

Under the Collection model the definition of disability is broad and includes learning difficulties, health and mental health conditions.

If your child is identified for inclusion in the Collection, the required information **about your child will be included in this year's data collection.**

Our Youth Development Voyages allow young people aged 15+ to experience a unique, challenging and inspirational adventure. These voyages typically run for 5 days and are designed to increase self awareness, develop communication, teamwork and leadership skills, and create a strong sense of community.

The STV One and All operates under the principle of “challenge by choice”. She is a working ship and all participants are expected to be involved in different aspects of ship operations, from setting sails, steering, navigating and cleaning the ship to climbing the masts. The level of challenge is up to each participant. Our many years of operation clearly demonstrate that the more each participant is willing to challenge themselves, the more they take away from the experience.

Each trainee will also leave the voyage with life skills learned from living in a small community. This includes learning to live with different personalities and cultures. It is also a time when trainees make new friends and achieve goals by **working through personal challenges.** The benefits of the program directly impact the individual's peers, their school, family and community. These benefits are also transferable as young people phase into adulthood as future employees and as responsible citizens in our communities. 



From the New Agriculture teacher.


I'm very excited to be starting an Agriculture course at PBAS this semester. We have a class of eleven year 9 and 10 students who have chosen the subject and are very interested in what we have planned for this year and beyond.

The school does not have an ag block but we have something better. We have dozens and dozens of local farmers and agriculture professionals that we are going to visit or invite into the classroom. There are many things that are hard to learn from books or the internet and tapping into local knowledge will be vital to learning industry best practice which is relevant to the agriculture in this district. 


