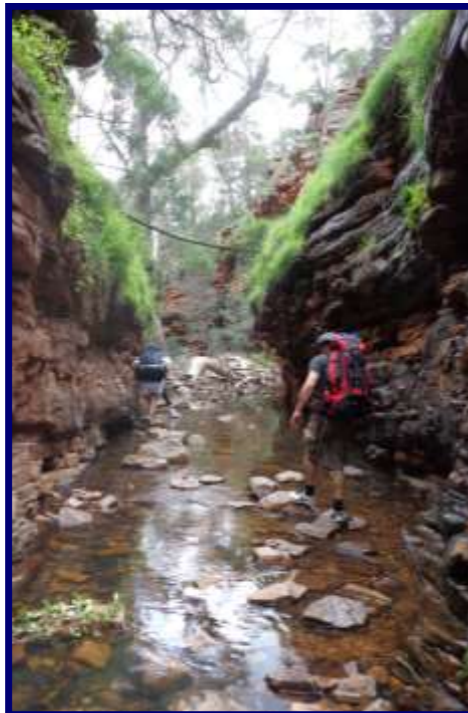

Uniform Expectations

The school uniform is approved by governing council and is compulsory. Uniform is a navy & gold school polo shirt (R-12) and navy school jumper (R-11), year 12 students design a year 12 jumper in school colours.
